## Family Policies

**Income tax splitting** allowing couples to split combined income 50/50 for tax purposes.

**Protect Franking Credits** by opposing the ALP's policy which unfairly taxes low and middle income earners and self-funded retirees.

**No Death Tax or Inheritance Tax** which imposes taxes on a family's future security.

**Student Credit Scheme** giving families control of a funding credit to be transferred to the school of their choice on the enrolment of their child.

- **Home Schooled** children would receive a pro-rata student credit.

**Public Housing Scheme** bringing all public housing under permanent Federal control with national low-income rental rates set at 25% of earnings and 15% for disabled occupants.

**Residential land** purchase will be limited to Australian citizens and permanent residents. Current foreign owners will have 10 years to sell their Australian properties.

**Negative gearing arrangements** remain as is for the first investment property. A sliding scale reduces ongoing tax benefits by 10% on the 2nd property, 25% on the 3rd, 50% on the 4th, 75% on the 5th and 100% on the 6th and all further properties.

**National Sports Insurance Scheme** to cover sports injury insurance for children and students under 19 who participate in a regulated sporting activity.

**National Addiction Taskforce** to address the growing problem of access and addiction to drugs, gambling, internet pornography and other harmful addictions that lead to family breakdown, gang violence, anti-social behaviour and violence against women.

**Cooperative Child Care** in which parents and carers are trained and certified to be "child carers" in their local neighbourhood and community.

**Ethical Health Care** – We oppose the ALP policy of withholding funding from hospitals that refuse to perform abortions. Taxpayer funds should not be used as blackmail.

**National Dental Scheme** – Children under 16 and pensioners receive free dental care.

## Box **P** in the Senate

## National Policies

**National Development Bank** to fund major Australian infrastructure projects through voluntary deposits from Superannuation funds instead of overseas borrowings.

**National Fuel Reserve** to guarantee a 12 months supply for emergency services, defence and public transport requirements and 6 months supply for the general public.

**National Food Security** – No majority foreign ownership of Australian agricultural land. Foreign leasing of agricultural land will be allowed for a maximum of 30 years.

**Construct Cleaner High Efficiency Low Emission (HELE)** clean coal power stations while investigating the economic viability and capabilities of new **Renewable Energy Sources**.

**No Taxpayer Subsidies** will be paid as profits to private energy companies. Redirect all subsidies to Health and Education funding and reduce overall taxation.

**Restore Public Ownership** of public utilities such as power, gas and water and reduce taxes by keeping profits in Australia and securing our children's future.

**Protect Public Assets** from future sell-off by making each one an Australian Co-operative in which every Australian on the Electoral Roll become the legal shareholders and owners.

**Restore Manufacturing** by withdrawing from the **1975 Lima Agreement** that has forced Australian companies offshore at the cost of hundreds of thousands of Australian based jobs.

**Review the 10 year delayed \$50 Billion French Submarine purchase** and examine better, cheaper, readily available options from regional allies such as the United States and Japan.

**Control Foreign Investment** by restricting foreign governments, companies and entities from gaining a controlling interest in any Australian Enterprise.

**National Employee Ownership Scheme** assisting employees to purchase their employers businesses when it is put up for sale, rather than losing the business and jobs overseas.

**Community Cooperative Scheme** to encourage and assist community cooperatives to establish local ownership of regional businesses including community post-offices, credit unions and for long term stability in regional areas.
